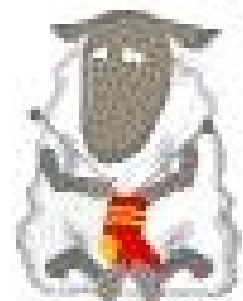
President's Message

Reversible Cables Homework

From Nazanin Fard

You will need to make two swatches for two different looks.

Materials:

1. Sport or worsted weight plain yarn in a light color
2. Knitting needles to match the yarn
3. 2 stitch markers
4. Safety pin
5. Cable needle

Instructions:

Note:

PM: Place Marker

Homework-1:

CO 16 sts.

Row 1: K 4, PM, (k2, p2) 2 times, PM, k4.

Row 2-6: Repeat row 1.

Homework-2:

CO 16 sts.

Row 1: K 4, PM, (k1, p1) 4 times, PM, k4.

Row 2-6: Repeat row 1.



Someone's In The Kitchen With . . .

This month's recipe is from: Diane Sack

Tomato, Mozzarella & Pesto Panini

Makes 6 sandwiches

2 large ripe beefsteak tomatoes

1 (16-oz) ball fresh mozzarella

12 slices ciabatta bread

About 1 cup prepared pesto

Salt

6 slices (3-oz) prosciutto

Butter, at room temperature

Heat frying pan. Slice the tomatoes and Mozzarella ¼" thick. Spread each slice of bread evenly with pesto. Place a layer of mozzarella (about 2 slices) on half of the bread & cover with a layer of tomato. Sprinkle the tomato with salt & top each with prosciutto. Place the remaining slices of bread, pesto side down on top. Spread the top & bottom of each sandwich with softened butter. Grill the sandwiches for 2 to 3 minutes, until the mozzarella starts to ooze. Cut each sandwich in half, and serve warm.

Next to home made BLTs this is my favorite summer time sandwich. This came from the Barefoot Contessa.
