• Swirled Mint Ice Cream Bars:

Ingredients:

- * 2 1/2 cups (about 22) finely ground creme-filled chocolate sandwich cookies
- * 3 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
- * 1 2/3 cups (10-oz. pkg.) NESTLÉ® TOLL HOUSE® SWIRLED™ Semi-Sweet & Premier White Morsels, divided
- * 1 container (1.5 quarts) Mint Chocolate Chip DREYER'S or EDY'S SLOW CHURNED Light Ice Cream, slightly softened
- * NESTLÉ NESQUIK Chocolate Flavor Syrup

DIRECTIONS:

LINE 13 x 9-inch baking pan with plastic wrap or foil with edges hanging over sides.

MIX cookie crumbs and butter in small bowl. Press onto bottom of prepared pan. Sprinkle 1 cup morsels over crumb crust. Scoop ice cream over morsels; spread evenly with knife or small spatula.

SPRINKLE with remaining 2/3 cup morsels and press down lightly. Freeze for about 2 hours.

TO SERVE, let stand for 5 minutes. Lift dessert out of pan; remove plastic wrap. Cut into bars. Drizzle with Nesquik.

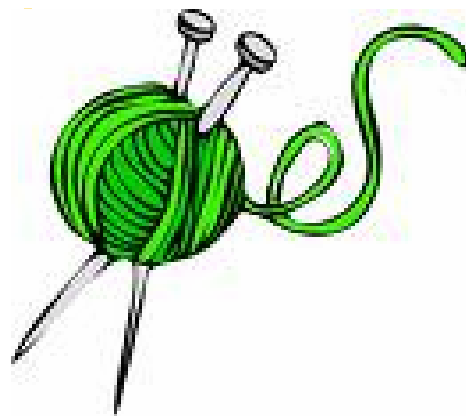

KNITTING TIPS:

Reduce Pilling on a Finished Garment:

Drop 2 or 3 drops of glycerin in the water for a complete cycle in the washing machine, if it's wash by hand, only 1 drop, no more because it's greasy!

Glycerin gives back softness to the yarn and you can use in with fabrics too but! NEVER DRY BY MACHINE!!! It will

stick and make all your efforts useless

Choosing a Needle Size for Unfamiliar Yarn:

Double your yarn and thread it through the closest size hole on your needle gauge. Whichever hole it fits through the neatest (neither tight nor with gaping spaces around the yarn) is the best needle size to do your first swatch with.
